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Guidelines on Student Supervisions

In order to guide the student properly, a faculty supervisor will be appointed to each student who has finished the required core courses. After Archaeo 206* the student has to choose the field of interest in archaeology that s/he wants to pursue. The student will write to the Director his/her research intent/ field of specialization. A faculty supervisor will then be assigned to that particular student. If the student still does not know his/her research interest, a temporary faculty supervisor will be assigned. The faculty supervisor will then advise the student on what courses to take that will help him/her develop the necessary skills and knowledge for his/her thesis. The student could also join the laboratory or workstation of his/her supervisor. The supervisor is not necessarily the thesis adviser of the student but if the student does choose him/her, then appropriate request can be addressed to the Director. If the student changes his/her research interest, a new faculty supervisor that has the specialization required of the research might be assigned. The student might then be asked to take additional courses (3-6 units), in line with the new specialization.
